

The cave where Jesus is to have slept. Very small—only 8 or so people can climb in at a time, hidden well inside the mountain. We climbed 122 steps to see it - and so worth it!



Further in from where Jesus slept, we found this "rock" where Jesus sat each of the three times He denied Satan's "temptations".



Masada is an ancient stone fortress in Israel, located high above the Dead Sea on a tall, rocky mesa. Now an Israeli national park and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the 840-acre complex holds well-preserved ruins attesting to the history of the ancient kingdom of Israel and the courage of its people in the face of a Roman siege.

Meaning "strong foundation or support" in Hebrew, Masada is a natural fortress built on top of a barren mountainous desert plateau thousands of feet above the Dead

Herod the Great, King of Judea, (who ruled from 37 to 4 B.C.) originally built Masada as a castle complex in the last century B.C. When the <u>ancient Romans</u> overtook Judea in the first century A.D., the grounds became a fortress for the Jewish people.


