It's probably the most famous quote from the Bible:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Oddly enough, many people don't realize that it was Jesus who spoke these words. On that day the Christmas child, now a fully-grown man, described how God has sent his "one and only Son" into the world.

In doing so, Jesus answered the most important question that can be asked about Christmas; "Why did Jesus come?"

Depending on whom you listen to, you might get a number of different impressions as to why Jesus came to the world that cold December day. Some suggest he came to give us a new moral code, emulate a new model of life, or present us a new philosophical outlook.

Fortunately, we have Jesus' own words. He gives us the real reason he came. God saw a world that was separated from Him by sin, but God still loved that world.

That love motivated God to give his one and only Son, "... That *whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.*"

In one sentence, Jesus takes us back to the very core of the Incarnation: Christmas is when a loving God saw a dying world and sent His Son to save us.

This Christmas – amid all the activities and events – may we pause to take Jesus' words to heart once more. May this knowledge infuse all that we during this wonderful season of celebrating with family and friends.

FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

The board held its first meeting of the fall on Oct. 11, 2014. The following items are the highlights of the meeting.

A “T Coil loop” and other hearing assist devices are being investigated for our sanctuary, along with additional lighting for the chancel area of the church. Proposals are being solicited from appropriate vendors and will be presented to the board at the November meeting.

The need for new landscaping at the front of the church was expressed. Further consideration of this item will be addressed at the November Board meeting.

The church dinners for Thanksgiving and Christmas are being organized.

The church finances are tacking the 2014 budget; however, two major occurrences have taken place. A lightning strike this summer and the repair of air conditioning equipment. These items were taken care of from our emergency funds.

A second columbarium has been ordered for the Memorial Garden and will arrive after Thanksgiving.

Pastor Wes Hyde advised the board of his desire to step down from his present position by the end of the year. Of course, Wes and Martha will remain members of the church and Wes will remain in the rotation as a Worship Service Leader.

The board discussed the need for one additional paid staff person; a part-time assistant for the church office and an assistant to take over Wes’ responsibilities as well as to work with Dave Murton on visitation. Our church demographics are changing and more emphasis needs to be placed on visitation needs and small group participation. Committees have been established to investigate these positions. These committees will report at the December board meeting.

As previously stated, the needs of our church family are changing. More dependency is being placed on our pastoral as well as front office positions. Our church is progressing from a volunteer led organization to a more paid staff organization. We naturally will still need volunteers for various positions in the church but some positions require paid staff. Along with increased needs and additional paid staff to service those needs, we will have additional financial requirements. Each of us needs to have prayerful consideration as to our financial commitment to the church. We are a wonderful endearing and loving church family that God has truly blessed. I am confident that with God’s help we will continue to meet the financial needs that are presented to our church.






Caregiver's Support Group

Praise the Lord! In September Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) held four, day long training sessions for eight of our Good News Club volunteers at Mims Methodist Church. After all training sessions were completed each participant then has to complete three “practicum’s” in a Good News Club in order to graduate.

In additions, another year has begun for our local Good News Clubs. Three clubs started up the first week of October.

Coquina Elementary meets weekly at the school on Monday’s and have 28 children registered.

Mims Elementary children are now meeting at the Mims Methodist Church on Tuesday’s and have 31 children registered. So far the transition from the school to the church has gone very smoothly.

Oak Park Elementary meets weekly at the school on Wednesday’s and have over 20 children registered.

In January, we plan on starting a new club at Pinewood Elementary school on Thursday’s.

The Clubs continue to need additional volunteer Grade Helpers. A Grade Helper is a person who sits with the kids, takes attendance, listens to their payer requests and develops relationships with them. This position is the main contact the child has with the Club. If you have a love for children we could really use you in this ministry.

Memory Garden Committee

It is hard to believe that three years ago that we did not have a Memorial Garden and a Columbarium. Today we have a wonderful garden and a Columbarium that is almost sold out. The columbarium has 100 niches and will hold 200 urns. We have ordered another columbarium of 90 niches, which will be delivered by the end of December.

When we were planning for the columbarium, we had to determine what we would be charging. We had decided on a price \$1250.00, with a pre-construction price of \$950.00. The price included the companion niche (holding 2 urns), the opening charges, inscriptions, and perpetual care, and 2 urns. When the columbarium was installed in the summer of 2012, we had about 30 niches for \$950.00, which was far below the cost of what was being offered in the Titusville area.

As we look forward to moving into the second phase of the columbarium, we have determined that we will price the companion niche at \$1350.00. Once again the price will include all of the items included in phase one. To buy the same type of service in the local cemetery would cost over \$4500.00. We will have some of the niches that will remain at \$950.00.


We escrow the money collected from the sales of the columbarium to provide the urns and the inscriptions and the maintenance of the garden for the years to come.
