

THE MEMORY GARDEN

The Memory Garden of the Great Outdoors Community Church is a beautiful, peaceful setting for meditation and prayer. The columbaria within, provide a permanent resting place for those who wish.

The first columbarium was installed when the garden was completed in 2012 and the second installed at the end of 2014. With these two, there are currently 190 niches, of which 118 have been purchased. We have ordered a third, which will contain an additional 90 niches and are expecting delivery in May 2019.

The current purchase price for a niche is \$1,350 for the top 7 rows and \$950 for the bottom 3 rows. This includes 2 companion urns, engraving for the granite face-plate inscriptions, opening of the niche to receive urns, all processing and document stamp. Monies received from niche purchases are escrowed to provide urns, inscriptions and future maintenance of the gardens.





The Singulars at GOCC have become a very active group in the life of the Church and they have set a busy schedule of activities that include:



GOCC connects people to God and to each other, by supporting missionaries around the world we are reaching beyond our little world of Titusville. The nine missionaries we support, with 15% our income, are affiliated with the following organizations:

Act Beyond (in Southeast Asia); Baptist International Ministries Inc, in Nepal, India;

Compassion Ministries (two in India); Ethnos 360, Senegal;

Pandamo Air Ministry, Venezuela; Pioneers, location to be determined; Stride Ministries at Hill AF Base, Utah; Wycliffe Translators, Papua New Guinea

<u>PLEASE REMEMBER IN PRAYER:</u> Pray for protection, physical strength, financial needs met, cultural differences, holy boldness in the Spirit, the words to speak, to be an example of love to all.

<u>Which Charity?</u> Has been pursing their mission since 1865; Assists approximately 25 million Americans annually;

Meets human needs without discrimination; Serves in 130 countries around the globe

The Salvation Army!

How Do They Accomplish All This? They assess the need, build local programs and invest in the Local Community.

The Salvation Army is an evangelical part of the universal Christian Church. Their message is based on the Bible, their ministry is motivated by the love of God and their mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ as they meet human needs in His name without discrimination.

Every program offered by The Salvation Army is rooted in their passion to serve God by serving the lost, the vulnerable, the needy, the poor, the hurting, the helpless, and the hopeless.

How Do They Meet Local Needs?

Assess the need FIRST: They assess the needs of each community in which they serve. They work to understand the obstacles, hardships, and challenges native to the area's particular population.

Build the Programs NEXT: They build local programs designed to offer immediate relief, short-term care, and long-term growth in the areas that will best benefit the community.

Invest in the Community, THEN: They offer these local programs to the community, working to continually optimize their efficacy via spiritual, physical, and emotional service.

THE SALVATION ARMY (TSA) EXISTS TO HELP HUMAN NEEDS

<u>HELP DISASTER SURVIVORS:</u> Over 90 million Americans become victims of natural disasters every year. Help comes in the way of Emergency Preparedness, Immediate Emergency Response, Long Term Disaster Recovery, and Spiritual and Emotional Care.

<u>CURE HUNGER</u>: Every day almost 50 million Americans face food insecurity. Each night 17.4 million Americans go to bed hungry. Each year they provide over 56 million meals through Food Pantries, Meal Programs and Community Gardens.

<u>OVERCOME POVERTY</u>: 14% of Americans live below the poverty line. **TSA** helps overcome poverty through Shelter, Meal Assistance, Pathway of Hope (to help break the cycle of crisis and vulnerability that repeats generation after generation) and Employment Assistance.

SERVE THE LGBTQ COMMUNITY: 40% of homeless youth in US identify as LGBTQ. The majority of homeless LGBTQ people end up on the streets before they are 18. One in four is homeless before 16 years of age. **TSA** is committed to serving by providing Shelter, Job Training, Helping with Substance Abuse, Food Insecurity and Teenage Suicide Prevention.

PROVIDE SHELTER: More than half a million people experience homelessness in America every day. 15% are considered "Chronically Homeless"; 8% are Veterans. Each night **TSA** shelters almost 30,000 homeless through Emergency Shelters, Group Homes, such as Transitional Living Centers and Family Service Programs.

<u>FIGHT HUMAN TRAFFICKING</u>: Victims, on average, first enter the American sex trade at age. Modern day slavery occurs in every state. Each year between 14,500 and 17,500 are trafficked in this country. **TSA** fights this through Awareness Initiatives, Comprehensive Care Management, and a Legacy of Justice for over 150 years.

STOP DOMESTIC VIOLENCE: Every hour 400 women become victims, every second 3 people become victims of violence; more than 10 million each year in US alone. **TSA** helps victims through The Cascade Women's & Children's Center, Phoenix Elim House, North West Division Center and local shelters.

EQUIP FAMILIES: Almost half of all high school students report gangs or gang members in their schools. **TSA** helps families through the KROC Community Centers, After-School Programs and Summer Schools.

<u>TEACH KIDS</u>: 40% of kids in poverty are ill-equipped to enter the elementary school. **TSA** operates hundreds of after-school programs and offers opportunities through Homework Assistance, Counselors, Sports, Clubs and Extra Curricular Activities, Dance, Art and Music Programs and Parental Coaching.

<u>EMPOWER THE ARTS</u>: Due to school budget cuts of Music and Art programs, **TSA** nurtures the Arts through Music Ministries, Music Camp and Worship Arts Retreats. Schools with music programs have an estimated 90.2% graduation rate vs. 72.9% at schools without a music program.

ASSIST THE UNEMPLOYED: Among the homeless 1/3 suffer mental health disorders - 37% men and 32% are women. **TSA** helps through Skill-Set Evaluations, Education and Skill Supplementation, Placement Assistance and Continual Support programs.

COMBAT ADDICTION: Alcohol abuse kills 75,000 people per year in US. **TSA** helps equip over 150,000 per year through Combat Addiction, Build Work and Social Skills, Regain Health & Stability and Restore Families. 300 people die every day as a result of drug or alcohol overdose and 9 million Americans misuse prescription drugs. The costs related to this are over \$700 billion annually and are enough to pay for every nurse's salary in United States for the next 9 years.

LOVE THE ELDERLY: Depression affects 7 million Americans over 65. 14% of those over 71 years of age are affected by dementia. **TSA** serves seniors through Community, Activities, Residences and Adult Day Care Centers.

<u>VETERANS</u>: Make up 8% of the homeless in the United States. **TSA** serves through Shelters, Adult Rehabilitation Centers and the Community.

SHARE GOD'S LOVE: 8 out of 10 Americans believe Spiritual Faith assists in disease recovery. In times of disaster 59% of people prefer support from a religious counselor or clergy member. **TSA** is a whole wide church.

MEET THE GREATEST NEED: 82 cents of every dollar goes to work in the community in which it is given.

GOCC mission funds going to TSA stay here in Brevard County, specifically to Titusville and Cocoa

MISSION DATES TO REMEMBER


<u>October</u> is the beginning of the "Operation Christmas Child". SHOE BOXES should be completed and brought to the church during the 3rd week of November.


