





Reflections from our Pastor . . .

Resurrection: The Powers Of The Coming Age

Nestled in a passage about persevering in faith, Hebrews 6:5 says something remarkable about those who have come to Christ. He says we have "... tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the coming age."

It's that last phrase I want you to note:
"The powers of the coming age"

The author of Hebrews is telling us, at rebirth God allowed us to "taste" what is yet to come in the next age. When and how were those powers introduced into this world?

It happened when God raised His Son from the dead. That's what Paul tells us in Ephesians 1:19-21:

"That power is like the working of his mighty strength, which he exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title that can be given, not only in the present age but also in the one to come."

For the apostles, the line between this current world and the world to come was breached at the moment God raised Jesus from the dead. As he broke the power of death over His Son he introduced the "powers of the coming age" into our world.

That same power came into our lives at rebirth. Romans 6:4 says, *"Just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."*

This Resurrection season we rejoice that God raised His Son from the dead. We also rejoice that the resurrection has released into our own lives "the power of the coming age."



HOPE FOR KIDS MEXICO

Supports Education for Mexican kids living in border towns. **What you can do: financial aid to the school in Mexico.**

SAMARITAN'S PURSE

\$2,000 Plus Designated Funds

Worldwide Ministry of Christian Service. This past year Samaritan's Purse collected 12 million shoebox gifts and shipped them to children over 100 countries. In Iraq they are working to provide food, blankets, proper shoes, medical clinics and other needs in the name of Jesus. Thanks to an irrigation canal built by the Samaritan's Purse in Cambodia, rice farmers now get two crops instead of one. They also have a "Healing Heart's" program, where they bring children to the states that need heart operations.

These are just part of what Samaritan's Purse is doing around the world. **What can you can do: financial aid, pray as they share the gospel with those oppressed and persecuted. Pray especially for the complicated process of delivering Operation Child Shoebox gifts.**

THE GIDEON'S INTERNATIONAL

Free Will Offering

Distributing Free Bibles throughout the World. **What you can do: Become a Gideon to distribute Bibles, pray for those who do, donate in someone's name to give a Bible to those in need.**

THE SALVATION ARMY

\$2,000 Plus Designated Funds

Meeting Physical & Spiritual Needs Around the World. Locally: they have a Soup Kitchen in Titusville, with two food pantries (Titusville and Cocoa), their ministry of music (Cocoa) allows for lessons on the learning the piano, reed instruments, drums and dance. They have a Domestic Violence Program with advocates who help their clients prepare for court, an undisclosed shelter that can house 20-24 women and children, and a 24 hour hot line. They have two church services (Titusville and Cocoa), a Home League that meets weekly (Cocoa) offering Bible studies with craft time, and a Women's Auxiliary that volunteers for various needs of the Army throughout the year. **What you can do: Donate food, clothing, volunteer at Christmas time with the Kettle program, pray for their resources and programs.**







Thank you for your get well cards and your prayers. It was so much appreciated.
