
How to set up your appointment:



MISSION COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2018

For the year 2018 the GOCC Board allowed the Missions Committee 15% of anticipated Income for budgeting purposes; this amounted to \$61,000 (2017 was 10% at \$47,000.).

Funds received and expensed throughout the year designated for missions or for specific organizations or individuals, amounted to \$80,979.80 (2017 was \$49,360).

Material Gifts from the Heart (which included the Angel Tree-200, Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes-264, scarves for missionaries-25, items knitted/crocheted/sewed/Beanie Baby's/ and other toys for Shoe Boxes, Socks, other odds and ends came to - \$18,500 (2017 was \$23,000). Food bags were included in 2017 year report; this year the food bags are under Outreach Committee.

With the above listed budget we have sponsored nine (9) missionary families, seven (7) International charities and five (5) local charities. Our Mission Team stays in contact with our missionaries and charities by phone, e-mail and newsletters. We have also been very fortunate to meet them in person when they are in the area. Casey Green of Pioneers recently visited our team updating us on her future plans to fly to Asia.

Shropshire family keeps us up to date on successful surgery for baby Mae and their desire to return to Senegal in January.

House of Hope in Brazil printer has been able to produce special gospel color books for children and printed translations of the Bible for the Palikur tribe.

It's so wonderful to hear of how God is meeting our Missionary's needs and giving them strength for the challenges they face. Our Mission Team upholds our missionaries in prayer, but what you, as a congregation gives, is so gratefully appreciated by our missionaries. They are constantly thanking us for your response and prayers. A letter signed by Franklin Graham posted on the Mission Bulletin Board is one recently received. A plea went out for donations for recent disaster in Florida. You, the congregation, gave \$15,513, and Missions gave \$4,587 so that a check for \$20,000 could be sent to Samaritan's Purse.

February 3, 2017 was our annual United Mission's Day. 197 tickets were sold @ \$10; \$1,755 checks of which \$650 was designated to specific missionaries. Expenses of \$438 for food left a balance of \$2,737 divided equally between Women In the Church (WIC), the Men's Group and Missions.

The kiss of the sun for pardon, The song of the birds for mirth, & One is nearer God's heart in a garden Than anywhere else on earth.




