Connection Groups



In early August the church concluded its first class for Connection Group leaders and soon many of those graduates will begin organizing Connection Groups in homes in TGO. This is a good thing, for many reasons.

Each of us now have another opportunity, outside of our Sunday experience at Great Outdoors Community Church to fellowship with other Church members; to get to know one another in a deeper more meaningful way. The “watch care” role of the Church, with members caring for the needs of members, will be expanded and enriched. That fulfills one of the two universal roles for Connection groups; spiritual growth.

The other major and common goal for our Connection Group movement is evangelism; helping non-believers (“seekers”) discover and enter into a life-saving relationship with Jesus Christ. There are many in this category living all around us; in TGO and in the local community. To many seekers, learning about Jesus in someone’s home in a “social” setting is much less intimidating than entering a church for the first time. For some seekers, the Connection Group will be a non-threatening way to what members believe and to see how they live an authentic Christian life.

We have already witnessed benefits from the Connection Group movement and it is anticipated this is just the beginning. If you believe you may want to lead a Connection Group, there will be another class starting soon. 




Eleven Believer's Baptisms took place on April 17, 2015
