“Connecting people to God, and to one another”: It’s more than just a mission statement - It’s the core activity of every ministry of our church.

During the forty-plus years I have been in pastoral ministry, I’ve seen many churches major on either “in-reach” or “outreach.” Often, the primary emphasis has been placed on one side of ministry to the detriment of the other.

I have never seen that approach work. Churches tend to become “us” focused, with little effort to bring people to Christ, so “them” focused believers are neglected.

That’s why I am so grateful that our church sees the importance of ministering to believers while reaching out to those who haven’t found a relationship with Christ.

There are so many ways we can do this. It can happen in the context of something as simple as having cup of coffee with a neighbor, or worshipping with nearly 500 people on a Sunday morning.

WIC, Men’s Breakfast, Small Groups, Outreach, Missions, Bible Study Groups, Music Concerts, Grief Share, Hospitality, Worship and Visitation, are all part of balancing our efforts to “connect people to God and to one another.”

As we move forward, let’s make every effort to keep the mission clearly in focus.






