As we approach Thanksgiving I have been doing some reading on what some famous historical personalities had to say about this special holiday. Here are a few quotes from them:

In his first Presidential Proclamation, president George Washington wrote, "It is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor." -- 1789

Samuel Adams, the father of the American Revolution, encouraged Americans to celebrate Thanksgiving with "... solemn thanksgiving and praise, that with one heart and one voice ... and consecrate themselves to the service of their divine benefactor ..." -- 1777

HELPING HANDS MINISTRY: We are looking for volunteers to manage the Helping Hands Ministry and someone to backup the Lending Closet Manger, who travels part of the summer.

Helping Hands generally runs on its own, covering 6 areas:

Transportation	Temporary Meals	Lending Closet (medical/baby equipment)
Home Repair	Respite Sitting for homebound	Senior Info about county services

We hold few meetings, but in the near future we need to set up a "Thank You" luncheon for our volunteers.

LENDING CLOSET: The Lending Closet is busier and requires accessing our storage areas to get the required item to the requestor and keeping track of our inventory.

COLD NIGHT SHELTER IN NORTH BREVARD:

The Cold Night Shelter is in need of twin air mattresses.

In addition, the shelter needs volunteers who are willing to occasionally stay overnight in the shelter to assist the Disabled Veteran's volunteers. The shelter, located at the DAV facility on Singleton, is open on nights when the temperature will drop below 45 degrees. Currently 6 churches rotate providing dinner and breakfast for about 30 homeless people.

The GOCC "Singulars" will host a special, church-wide dinner *and you don't want to miss this one!* Dinner will be served in Fellowship Hall as retired Astronaut Sam Durrance and wife Rebecca serve as guest speakers.

Sam is a scientist, FIT Professor, and a twice-flown Shuttle payload specialist (STS-35 & STS-67). He and his wife are Brevard residents with a long history of support and involvement in the aerospace industry, education and the church.

Sam Durrance was not a NASA trained astronaut, but rather a payload specialist contracted by a company to join other astronauts in space. For two flights and 615 hours in space, he assisted crews with operating sophisticated scientific equipment aimed at understanding our universe.

He received Bachelor's and Master's degrees in physics from California State University. He then attended the University of Colorado, completing a Ph.D. in astrogeophysics. He worked at Johns Hopkins University as the principal research scientist in the Department of Physics and Astronomy. While at Johns Hopkins, he began his work as co-investigator for the Hopkins Ultraviolet Telescope. When it came time to deploy the telescope, NASA selected Dr. Durrance as a payload specialist on space shuttle mission STS-35/Astro 1. Both that mission and STS-67/Astro 2, which Durrance flew on, were dedicated missions to astronomy.

While not in space, Dr. Durrance has made great strides in ground-based astronomy. At Johns Hopkins University, he created a program to develop adaptive-optics instrumentation, which counteracts the atmosphere so we can have a clearer image of what's beyond. He also discovered a cool brown dwarf planet with the help of his team who designed and constructed the Adaptive Optics Coronagraph.







Following are portions of a letter received from our missionaries in Venezuela:

10/06/2018

Dear friends: Greetings in our Precious Lord's name. We have much to be thankful for these days. Keila continues to feel good and her strength is pretty much back to normal. She has to go out in a couple of weeks for her last doctor checkup, but we don't anticipate there being any problems relating to her surgery. It is getting more and more difficult to get back and forth to town. Our airstrip is once again closed off and special permission is required to use it. This permission is getting more and more difficult to get.

We are being battered by a hyperinflation that is just head shaking. So far the government has taken off a total of 8 zeros from their currency. This means that at the old currency we are currently at 1,029,700,000 TO ONE DOLLAR!!!! Along with the hyperinflation, there are shortages of everything from food, toilet paper and fuel. This is a hurting country. Prayers appreciated for this poor country.

Through all the years we have been serving overseas as missionaries, we have never had a place to call our own to go and come from. This has caused difficulties, as we return to the field we leave our stuff scattered in people's basements and attics across the USA. Problem is, we very seldom return to the same place we took off from years earlier, so we always have a dreadful time trying to remember where we left our church clothes etc, so we wind up having to purchase new, or as has happened many times, we arrive on a Saturday evening and head to church in our faded jungle jeans.

So for the last dozen years or so, we have started thinking and praying about this need. Also, as our ministry has grown our support team has expanded geographically to the point that we now have ministry partners as far apart as Florida to New Hampshire over to Michigan and upper Wisconsin, then south, going through Missouri on back down to Florida and through most of the states crossed through. Basing out of Florida or Illinois or Virginia as we have always done in the past no longer is as efficient as we think we could be. Now that R and J are ready to head to the field we have discussed the problem that this has become and they are excited to partner with us in this effort. This will ensure that they have a place to base out of as well.

We are planning on returning to the USA sometime late December so we can be there on the ground getting everything ready for the construction group. R and J will also be in the USA from Costa Rica and R will be at the site with us. Building a base of operations in the United States is a huge undertaking for us and we covet your prayers as we make plans, seek financing and get started on this project. If there are any of you who would like more information on how you could help or otherwise get involved please don't hesitate to ask.

During our time in the USA Keila and I are also hoping to get some much needed rest; these last number of years in Venezuela have been difficult to say the least and we find ourselves tired.

Prayer Requests: 1) This country continues its non-stop slide into chaos. It is becoming more difficult on almost a daily basis for us to find what is needed to live and minister;

 2) Our health; and

 3) Wisdom and needed resources to build our base of operations near Macon, GA.

Again, Thanks so much for your partnership with us, we are honored and humbled. We would love to hear from you all.

I really cannot thank you enough for all your prayers as my son David, my granddaughter Casey, and I went back to Brazil on September 21 to visit our Palikur Indian friends in the Amazon Jungle. The Palikur were having a big celebration for the 50th anniversary of receiving the Word of God, which Harold and I translated for them. They insisted that we come and I am so happy that we did. It was a special pleasure to be able to present to them a projector for each Palikur church and school, thanks to your generosity.

Every day in Brazil was perfect. Things I thought would be big problems were no problem at all. I was treated like a queen everywhere. We distributed the newly-reprinted New Testament to many people. The Palikur adored Casey and she loved them back. Her most repeated phrase was, "Nah batek." (I like it!)

The people are so much better off physically and spiritually than they were fifty years ago when they did not know the Lord! I was able to talk in depth with most of the twelve Palikur pastors, many of whom came from far-away villages. *I was impressed. They know the Word.* They know how to deal with false teachers. They love their flocks. Their whole family is involved. They have pastoral gifts. They were all thrilled to receive a projector for their church and school. Below are pictures of Pastor Nathan receiving his projector, and of me, teaching a lesson with the use of one of the projectors.



The last night they had a special farewell service. At least a hundred people came up to hug us. Many looked me in the eye and said, "If you had not come, I would not know God." It was like heaven, and we were all soaked with tears.

One man said, "After we stopped killing one another and forgave one another and began to live together in one large village, the government made us a school and a clinic. Education and medical help is good, but it was you who gave us HOPE. That is what changed everything."

We praise God for his life-transforming power. As I told them, "God's Word is your daily food; it is medicine for your wounds; it is your bathing-place; it is your protection from error; it is the place you hear from God. Keep in this Word." Now, after so many years, I have again seen the truth of this with my own eyes.




