Reflections from Pastor David. . .

**Dear Friends:** 

A thousand years before Christ was born, a man who had been given supernatural wisdom wrote:

"To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven."

I've been meditating on these words since my accident and subsequent surgery.

Solomon said there is a season and a time for everything "under heaven." That's the controlling thought in this passage; "under heaven."

Solomon balances what we might feel are the negative things that happen in life with the positive things, for example, birth and death, and tearing and healing.

All of these things are human activities, but Solomon reminds us that nothing happens to us that is outside of God's control. While some things happen because of human choices or errors, God has not relinquished control of His world. God continues to direct the times and the seasons.

Warren Berkely reflected on this passage and wrote: "[Knowing this] helps me live here with some sense of sanity and balance and confidence..."

I don't know what you are dealing with today, but you can know that God is still in control of His world and your world. He continues to direct the times and the seasons of life.

Trust Him! He knows what He is doing.

## Inspiration....

I always wondered why, when Jesus spoke of us as His "branches" in John 15, He compared Himself to a "vine" instead of to a "tree". One day I discovered that the word "vine" in Greek means "that which is coiled about a strong support." And then I knew. Jesus' strength to stand, to act, to bear fruit, came from His attachment to His Father. He whole-heartedly committed Himself to obey the Father, and each act of obedience, especially when it crossed His own personal desires, was an act of "coiling" about Him. The most vivid picture we have of that commitment is at Gethsemane where He repeated "not my will, but the Father's" and then went on to endure the cross, but it began long, long before that, and continues long afterward, as we, in Him, make that same commitment.

# The Vine-Tree

At the foot of the cross, the Father planted a grapevine. In the earth it took root and it lifted its shoots toward the cross. It did not turn away by choosing to stray where it wished to. But grew into a vine that coiled tightly entwined with the cross.

Then the branches appeared, bearing fruit pure and sweet for the Father. And to help them bear more He carefully trimmed them away. 'Til they lodged themselves deep into union complete with the grapevine; Fully one with the vine that coiled tightly entwined with the cross.

As the branches were filled with the sap of the vine, they had more life, And the fruit that they bore increased more and more for their Lord. Til the whole world could see a beautiful tree from a grapevine, A strong upright vine that coiled tightly entwined with the cross.
