REFLECTIONS

A Thanksgiving Hymn

*"We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing,
He chastens and hastens His will to make known;
The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing,
Sing praises to His name, He forgets not His own.*

Certain hymns have a way of endearing themselves to us. I find that's the case with a hymn we often sing at Thanksgiving; "We Gather Together". Like many others, it has a rich history.

In the sixteenth century, Dutch Christians (Protestants) had undergone severe persecution during the reign of the Spanish King Phillip II. They were forbidden to hold public worship services, so worship was limited to individual devotions in their homes.

In 1597, Prince Maurice of Orange defeated the Spanish occupiers of a town in what is now the Netherlands. For the first time, the Christians were allowed to meet for worship. They celebrated by taking a tune from a folk song and giving it new lyrics. The result was the hymn, "We Gather Together".

The hymn is punctuated with references to their struggles for religious freedom. It's evident in phrases like, "The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing", as well as, "So from the beginning, the fight we were winning."

Sometime around the 1620's Dutch immigrants brought this hymn to the New World. It wasn't sung in their worship services because Dutch Calvinists insisted on lyrics taken directly from the Bible.

Almost three hundred years would pass before "We Gather Together" appeared in an American hymnal. Since 1935 it has found strong representation in most denominational hymnals.

It's not only a hymn of thanksgiving for the freedom to gather for worship – it's also a recognition that the battle is far from over. In the last stanza of this beloved hymn we find these words:

*We all do extol Thee, Thou leader in battle,
And pray that Thou still our defender wilt be.
Let Thy congregation escape tribulation;
Thy name be ever praised: O Lord, make us free!*

The Dutch Christians never assumed the battle was over! In our era, when our own Christian freedoms seem so imperiled, may we take encouragement from this great hymn.

The Supper 6 Program

The first month of Supper 6 meetings has gone well for the 7 groups that have been formed in this new fellowshiping adventure at GOCC. If you have not been a participant yet, don't worry, we will soon be holding signups for the next groupings for January, February and March.

It is a simple but elegant program that involves six people (couples and singles are included in many of the groups) having a pot-luck dinner together in someone's home. These dinners take place once a month for three successive months. Once you sign up you will be randomly assigned to your Supper 6 group. Someone in your group will be assigned to serve as "host" for the first of the three supper meetings of the group.

The first host will contact the other members of the group to let them know they have been assigned to the group. After contacting the other members of group a date and time for the first supper meeting will be determined and group members will volunteer to bring various parts of the meal – the host will provide the main course and typically will hold the first supper in their home. If the host person or couple does not have a home that can accommodate that large a group, another couple or individual can volunteer to substitute their home. Host duties will rotate for the next two supper meetings.

The host will offer a prayer at the beginning of the Supper 6 meal and will stimulate conversation during the supper. No alcohol is to be served at these suppers.




Dear Friend,


Prison Book Project is now 21 years old. We have operated with no paid staff since the beginning and still do so.

While labor is free, shipping is not. Neither is facility space. The cost to rent warehouse space is rapidly depleting our "Building Fund Reserve" Without warehouse space, we will not be able to operate. In the last four years we have distributed 1.1 million books. There are 250 tons of books in our warehouse with more arriving daily.

To continue to operate Prison Book Project, we must build our donor base. The number of facilities requesting material is also increasing. We serve more than 2,000 facilities and still have approximately 900 on our waiting list.

If we can get 300 additional contributors to donate \$25.00 a month we will be able to continue to Touch Lives Behind Bars for now.

We need to get these books into the hands that need them. Lives are being changed. 95% of the people incarcerated today will be back on the streets in the future. The Gospel will make the difference. Will you be one of the 300?
